according to the Book of Common Prayer (1979)

Sundays at 5:00pm

Cantor The Lord Almighty grant us a peaceful night and a perfect end.

Response Amen.

Cantor Our help is in the Name of the Lord;

Response The maker of heaven and earth.

Officiant Let us confess our sins to God.

Silence is kept

Said by all **Almighty God, our heavenly Father:
We have sinned against you,
through our own fault,
in thought, and word, and deed,
and in what we have left undone.
For the sake of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ,
forgive us all our offences
and grant that we may serve you
in newness of life,
to the glory of your Name. Amen**

Officiant May the Almighty God grant us forgiveness of all our sins,
And the grace and comfort of the Holy Spirit.

Response Amen.

Cantor O God, make speed to save us

Response O Lord, make haste to help us.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in
the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

Except in Lent Alleluia.

One or more of the following Psalms is sung.

Psalm 4 (*1st Sunday*)

Answer me when I call, o God, defender of my cause;
You set me free when I am hard-pressed;
have mercy on me and hear my prayer.
“You mortals, how long will you dishonor my glory?”
how long will you worship dumb idols
and run after false gods?
Know that the Lord does wonders for the faithful:
when I call upon the Lord, he will hear me.
Tremble, then, and do not sin;
speak to your heart in silence upon your bed.
Offer the appointed sacrifices
and put you trust in the Lord.
Many are saying,
“Oh that we might see better times!”
Lift up the light of your countenance upon us, O Lord.
You have put gladness in my heart,
more than when grain and wine and oil increase.
I lie down in peace; at once I fall asleep;
for only you, Lord, make me dwell in safety.

Psalm 31 (*2nd Sunday*)

In you, O Lord, have I taken refuge;
let me never be put to shame:
deliver me in your righteousness.
Incline your ear to me:
make haste to deliver me.
Be my strong rock, a castle to keep me safe,
for you are my crag and my stronghold;
for the sake of your Name, lead me and guide me.
Take me out of the net that they have secretly set for me,
for you are my tower of strength.
Into your hands I commend my spirit,
for you have redeemed me,
O Lord, O God of truth.

Psalm 91:1-4,11-17 (*3rd Sunday*)

He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High
abides under the shadow of the Almighty.

He shall say to the Lord,
 “You are my refuge and my stronghold,
 my God in whom I put my trust.”
He shall deliver you from the snare of the hunter
 and from the deadly pestilence.
He shall cover you with his pinions,
and you shall find refuge under his wings;
 his faithfulness shall be a shield and buckler.
For he shall give his angels charge over you,
 to keep you in all your ways.
They shall bear you in their hands,
 lest you dash your foot against a stone.
You shall tread upon the lion and the adder,
 you shall trample the young lion and the
 serpent under your feet.
Because he is bound to me in love,
 therefore will I deliver him;
 I will protect him, because he knows my Name.
He shall call upon me, and I will answer him;
 I am with him in trouble;
 I will rescue him and bring him to honor.
With long life will I satisfy him
 and show him my salvation.

Psalm 42:1-7 (*4th Sunday*)

As the deer longs for the water-brooks,
 so longs my soul for you, O God.
My soul is athirst for God, athirst for the living God;
 when shall I come to appear before the presence of God?
My tears have been my food day and night,
 while all day long they say to me,
 Where now is your God?"
I pour out my soul when I think on these things;
 how I went with the multitude and led them into the
 house of God,
With the voice of praise and thanksgiving,
 among those who keep holy-day.
Why are you so full of heaviness, O my soul?
 and why are you so disquieted within me?
Put your trust in God;
 for I will yet give thanks to him,
 who is the help of my countenance, and my God.

Psalm 91:5-12 (*5th Sunday*)

You shall not be afraid of any terror by night,
nor of the arrow that flies by day;
Of the plague that stalks in the darkness,
nor of the sickness that lays waste at mid-day.
A thousand shall fall at your side
and ten thousand at your right hand,
but it shall not come near you.
Your eyes only have to behold
to see the reward of the wicked.
Because you have made the LORD your refuge,
and the Most High your habitation,
There shall no evil happen to you,
neither shall any plague come near your dwelling.
For he shall give his angels charge over you,
to keep you in all your ways.
They shall bear you in their hands,
lest you dash your foot against a stone.

At the end of the Psalm(s) is sung

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit:
As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

One of the following is sung

Lord, you are in the midst of us, and we are called by your Name:
Do not forsake us, O Lord our God.
Thanks be to God.

Jeremiah 14: 9, 22

Come to me all who labor and are heavy-laden, and I will give you rest.
Take my yoke upon you and learn from me; for I am gentle and lowly in
heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my
burden is light.
Thanks be to God.

Matthew 11. 28-30

May the God of peace, who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus,
the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant,
equip you with everything good that you may do his will. Working in
you that which is pleasing in his sight; through Jesus Christ, to whom
be glory for ever and ever.
Thanks be to God.

Hebrews 13: 20-21

Be sober, be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. Resist him, firm in your faith.
Thanks be to God.

1 Peter 5: 8-9

This evening hymn is sung

Tread under foot our ghostly foe,
that no pollution we may know.*

Praesta Pater piissime
Patrique compar unice
cum Spiritu Paraclito
Regnans per omne saeculum. Amen.

*O Father, that we ask be done,
through Jesus Christ, thine only son
Who with the Holy Ghost and thee,
doth live and reign eternally. Amen.*

Then follows

In manus tuas Domine,
commendo spiritum meum
redemisti nos Domine,
Deus veritatis.

*Into your hands, O Lord,
I commend my spirit
for you have redeemed me,
O Lord, O God of truth.*

Cantor Keep us, O Lord, as the apple of your eye;
Response Hide us under the shadow of your wings.
Lord, have mercy.
Christ, have mercy.

Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;

on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,

Cantor Lord, hear our prayer;
Response And let our cry come to you

Cantor Let us pray.

One or more of the following collects are sung

Be our light in the darkness, O Lord, and in your great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of your only Son, our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

Be present, O merciful God, and protect us through the hours of this night, so that we who are wearied by the changes and chances of this life may rest in your eternal changelessness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Look down, O Lord, from your heavenly throne and illumine this night with your celestial brightness; that by night as by day, your people may glorify your holy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Visit this place, O Lord, and drive far from it all snares of the enemy; let your holy angels dwell with us to preserve us in peace; and let your blessings be upon us always; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

One of the following prayers may be added

Keep watch, dear Lord, with those who work, or watch, or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep. Tend the sick, Lord Christ; give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous; and all for your love's sake. Amen.

O God, your unfailing providence sustains the world we live in and the life we live: Watch over those, both night and day, who work while others sleep, and grant that we may never forget that our common life depends upon each other's toil; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Silence may be kept, and free intercessions and thanksgivings may be offered

A short anthem is sung

The choir sings
