Prelude

*Please stand at the entrance of the ministers; occasionally there may be an opening **Hymn***

<i>Cantor</i>	O Lord, open thou our lips.
<i>Response</i>	And our mouth shall shew forth thy praise.
<i>Cantor</i>	O God, make speed to save us.
<i>Response</i>	O Lord, make haste to help us.
<i>Cantor</i>	Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost;
<i>Response</i>	As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.
<i>Cantor</i>	Praise ye the Lord.
<i>Response</i>	The Lord's name be praised.

*Please sit for the **Psalm**, and stand for the Gloria Patri at the end*

*Please sit for the **Old Testament Lesson***

*On Sundays, please stand for the **Office Hymn** when one is sung*

*Please sit for **Magnificat**, and stand for the Gloria Patri at the end*
